STAGE 1: PLANNING

What are the aims and objectives of the policy?

What are the desired outcomes/ what constitutes 'success'?

Section 15 of the Violence against Women, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence (Wales) Act 2015 ("the Act") gives the Welsh Ministers a power to issue statutory guidance to relevant authorities (as defined in the Act) on how the authorities should exercise their functions with a view to contributing to the pursuit of the purpose of the Act.

The Welsh Ministers intend to use their power to issue guidance to local authorities, Local Health Boards, fire and rescue authorities and NHS Trusts in Wales to promote high quality collaborative commissioning that delivers more consistent and effective services to prevent Violence against Women, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence (VAWDASV) and protect and support victims across Wales.

The guidance will provide a framework for the commissioning of VAWDASV services to meet needs effectively and fairly across Wales by enabling the creation of regional collaborative VAWDASV partnerships. This will help to ensure consistency of provision across the whole country and contribute to the achievement of Objective 6 (Provide victims with equal access to appropriately resourced, high quality, needs led, strength based, gender responsive services across Wales) in the Welsh Government's National Strategy on VAWDASV: 2016- 2021.

The Welsh Ministers are required by the Act to publish annual reports of the progress made towards achieving both the objectives in the National Strategy and achievement towards the purpose of the Act, as well as to publish national indicators that can be used to measure collective national progress in achieving the purpose of the Act. The first progress report was published in January 2018.

Officials have considered two options:

- Do nothing: although there are many examples of current good practice, there is currently no national guidance to ensure that service provision is consistent across Wales
- Issue statutory guidance to promote high quality collaborative commissioning that delivers more consistent and effective services to prevent VAWDASV and protect and support victims across Wales.

Issuing the guidance will contribute towards achieving our objectives set out in the National Strategy on VAWDASV.

The importance of considering Welsh language issues and ensuring that the Welsh language is not treated any less favourably than the English language is highlighted in the guidance, therefore ensuring that support for victims is made available in Welsh to those who need, and choose to, receive this support in Welsh.

Although no effects on the Welsh language, adverse or positive, are anticipated as a result of the publication of the final guidance, the consultation document will include the question – “What opportunities does this guidance give to promote the use of the Welsh Language? Do you have concerns that this guidance could have an adverse effect on opportunities to use the Welsh language”.

Who are the stakeholders? Are the needs of Welsh speakers and learners addressed? To what extent are Welsh language interest groups likely to respond positively to the proposals?

VAWDASV issues potentially affect anyone in Wales but the main stakeholders for the guidance are:

- The relevant authorities under the Act (local authorities, Local Health Boards, fire and rescue authorities and NHS Trusts in Wales) and responsible authorities as defined by the Crime and Disorder Act 1998
- Current and future service commissioners at national, regional and local levels
- Providers of services, statutory or non-statutory, specialist and non-specialist
- Those with an interest in providing funding for VAWDASV and related services in Wales

The commissioning guidance could have limited positive effects on the Welsh language, including a positive impact on those who want to receive VAWDASV services through the medium of Welsh.

The relevant authorities will, over time, become liable to comply with the Welsh Language Standards that apply to them as individual organisations. Therefore, they will need to provide bilingual services in line with their responsibilities under their Welsh Language Standards. The guidance also highlights the need to build Welsh language considerations in to any procurement process relating to VAWDASV service provision.
